This paradigm shift recognizes the opportunity to provide non-clinical interventions focused on a whole-person care approach via Medi-Cal that targets social determinants of health and reduces health disparities and inequities. Another significant change we will see with CalAIM is payment reform which hinges on the outcomes of services instead of the services themselves. Additionally, Medi-Cal managed care plans will be required to improve the coordination of services provided by community-based providers like WestCare.

As we venture into the new year, I see nothing but new opportunities for success and a year that brings peace, love, and happiness to you and your loved ones!

WestCare California, Inc.'s **Custody to Community Transitional Reentry Program (CCTRP)** program, in collaboration with the California Department of Corrections (CDCR), is a residential program focused on reducing recidivism through targeted and evidence-based interventions. The program serves up to 112 high-risk female offenders who are in the last two years of their sentence by providing a place for them to reside within the community rather than in an institution. The aim is to prepare clients to successfully re-enter the community with a focus on gender-responsive and trauma-informed services.

WestCare assists with the development of educational and vocational skills and links women to health care and education. The women begin work on family reunification, payment of restitution, resolving child support issues, and beginning community living.

"First, I would like to thank the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation (CDCR) for giving me the option to come to WestCare. This program has given me many tools that have helped in my transition from prison to becoming a functioning, productive member of society again.

I am so excited to have this opportunity to share with others that change is possible. I recently woke up to a wonderful email from my criminology professor, a retired federal parole agent, telling me how proud she is of me and inviting me to lunch.

I was not always a criminal, but I made some poor choices in my life. I had gotten divorced and was looking for a way to supplement my alimony. A friend's girlfriend had asked me to transport drugs as means to supplement my income. Sadly, I became addicted to the product I was moving and I went from an IT analyst to a drug addict and then to prison.

Through the wonderful counseling and therapy at WestCare, I gained the confidence to become a well-rounded individual that knows how to set boundaries and express themselves in a healthy way. The vocational classes WestCare provides are invaluable. I cannot speak highly enough about their vocational program. It taught me how to interview confidently, interact with others, and write a resume.

I believe that it should be mandatory for everyone in similar situations to come to WestCare. The dedication the staff has put into my treatment is invaluable. I am now able to set both personal and professional goals and achieve them. I am currently working on my Bachelor of Science in Administration of Justice and have a 4.0 GPA, a valid driver's license with no blemishes, an insurance card, 720 credit score, debit and credit card, and medical insurance. After the recent passing of my stepfather, I became a great support system for my mom, which is a wonderful feeling after all the grief I once caused. I continue to maintain a healthy relationship with both my children and ex-husband. I can honestly say being a client at WestCare has changed me for the better. The program gave me the tools to become a more fortunate and contented person." - Mary K. Lee






Kudos to SJVV – Stockton and STOP Area 1: North Highlands!

In December, our San Joaquin Valley Veterans (SJVV) team in Fresno had a few busy days of giving back to our Veterans and their families! On December 22, their staff delivered meals from Boston Market to program participants. This was made possible by their Supportive Services for Veteran Families (SSVF) funding, which allows them to provide meals to ensure that no Veteran goes hungry. SSVF Program Coordinator, Yadi Renteria, commented, "We are thankful for this opportunity as we have been able to partner with the Boston Market to coordinate meal preparation for over 60 Veteran households!"

On December 23, Lead Veteran Advocate, Christina Valtierra; Case Manager Savannah Corbin, and Outreach Specialist, Raymond Gonzales, delivered meals to Veterans residing at the **Renaissance at Parc Grove** affordable housing community. In total, 30 households received a warm breakfast prepared by our amazing community partners with the **Fresno Housing Authority**.
