James Ralph Jenkins, the man whom everyone called Jim, was the man that I called Dad. He was not always an easy man to live with, as his moods could change rapidly, but I always knew he loved me, and when I needed him, he was there for me. While my father was not highly educated, there was rarely a subject he couldn't speak on and, even more, nothing he couldn't fix if broken. He was a Veteran of the Korean War, a licensed aircraft mechanic, and a well-known and respected agricultural pilot, better known as a crop duster pilot. He taught me the meaning of hard work, hard love, and the value of honesty and standing up for myself. He was very understanding and supportive when I made big mistakes or what I call, life's lessons, but was highly critical of the little mistakes. I later came to understand what I felt were significant mistakes or life lessons were simply events that I had not experienced before. My father was understanding and supportive of this. Now, the little

mistakes were a different story as he knew that I knew better than to make those and his expectations of me were rightfully higher. Our relationship changed over the years, as happens when you age. He witnessed my marriage, the birth of my two sons, Dylan and Giovanni, and my transformation from a son to a father. The love and lessons received by my father (and my mother) helped shape me into the man that I am today. He prepared me for the day when he was no longer here and even though I didn't think I was ready for that day, he knew I would be sad, but I'd be okay. Dad, I love you, miss you, and know that you hear me when I communicate with you. I know in society's eyes, they would call you stepdad or stepfather, but to me, you will always be Dad and you were the Dad that you didn't have to be. I know that when it's my time, we will see each other again, but until that day, I will continue to prepare my children so they will be okay when I am no longer on this earth.

I'd also like to recognize the fathers that we serve and our staff who are fathers themselves. Your gifts of time, patience, and guidance to your loved ones should always be celebrated and never taken for granted. For all that you do, we thank you. *(Continued on Page 4)*

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Program Spotlight: The Holy Cross Health & Wellness Center / Day 1 Families Fund

The Holy Cross Health & Wellness Center, located on the grounds of The Poverello House, holds three of the 15 programs that make up Housing Services. The Day 1 Families Fund is a housing program that serves individuals and families experiencing homelessness or at risk of homelessness. Our program provides financial assistance for security deposits, rent, utilities, transportation, and moving costs. Through case management services, clients are provided with linkages to referrals that may benefit them. Participants can attend our Day 1 Family Fund life skills classes which primarily focus on sustaining housing. Through the Day 1 Families Fund, clients have the tools for success!

Our educator on-site provides weekly classes such as quality tenancy, budgeting, and resume building. All clients served by our housing team have access to this resource. Holy Cross also stations the Fresno Madera Continuum of Care's (FMCoC) community coordinator and housing matcher on site. The focus of these roles is to process individuals experiencing homelessness through our Coordinated Entry System (CES). They monitor the referrals coming through the community and ensure that each individual/family is matched to the appropriate housing opportunity. These roles monitor clients progress through the community until they are successfully placed in permanent housing. We also have our Warm Handoff team on site which serves formerly incarcerated individuals. Through case management, education, vocational training and linkages, formerly incarcerated individuals can reintegrate back into society.

We are also proud to work alongside fellow community-based providers, who utilize the facility for their unique services. Saint Agnes Medical Center operates their Saint Agnes Women's Center, which is a drop-in location that provides clothing and diapers to women and children. Additionally, Kings View Behavioral Health Systems provides mental health services.

A Day 1 Families Fund Success Story featuring Jane:

Jane and her five children were referred to the Day 1 Families Fund in May of 2022. She was fleeing an abusive relationship and came to Fresno to start over. She had exhausted all of her funds paying for hotel and Airbnb stays. Her and her family only had what could fit in their car. Once she was connected to Day 1, we were able to secure housing for her within two days of enrollment. Our navigator placed a referral to Wings Advocacy Fresno to provide her family with furniture including beds for her little ones. Jane continues to be connected through case management while receiving rental assistance. Our program is currently assisting her with rental assistance, utility assistance, and monthly budgeting. Jane will be working on building her savings to sustain housing and is on track to successful permanent
