September 16 continues to be a very important day for the people of Mexico, as it marks the independence of Mexico from Spain. On that day in 1810, Miguel Hidalgo y Costilla, a priest and one of the leaders fighting for Mexico's Independence, is believed to have made the cry for independence (El Grito de la Independencia, or Grito de Dolores) in the town of Dolores, in the present north-central city of Dolores Hidalgo, Guanajuato. Every year on the eve of Independence Day, the President of Mexico re-enacts the cry from the balcony of the National Palace in Mexico City, while ringing the same bell Hidalgo used in 1810. The colors of Mexico's flag - green, white, and red - can be seen all around wherever the holiday is celebrated and delicious traditional foods and drinks are enjoyed with friends and family along with celebratory cries of "Viva México" or "Viva la Independencia." Traditional mariachi music can be heard throughout the celebrations with lively dancing. Of course, food is one of the most important aspects of Independence Day celebrations with restaurants and street vendors selling traditional Mexican food. This includes chiles en nogada (stuffed peppers in walnut sauce), pozole or menudo, tamales, chips with guacamole or salsa, and pan dulce for dessert. Mexican Independence Day has developed into a huge nationwide celebration over the past 200-plus years. You don't have to be Mexican or live in Mexico to celebrate Mexican Independence Day. Anyone can join the fiesta! Communities around the world commemorate the day with special events and reflect on the deeper meaning of the holiday, honoring those who sacrificed to make it happen.

WestCare Adolescent Services and SAMHSA Family TREE staff participated in the 2022 Recovery Week organized by Champions Recovery Alternative Programs in Kings County in commemoration of National Recovery Month. The teams participated in dress up days from Tuesday, Sept. 6 through Friday, Sept. 9 and culminated on Saturday, Sept. 10 with Recovery Fest at Lacey Park in Hanford. The themes were the following: "Lei Off Drugs" on Tuesday, "Give Drugs the Boot" on Wednesday, "Keep your Mind and Body Feeling Rad" on Thursday, and "Wear Purple" on Friday.

At Recovery Fest, the teams were able to educate attendees on the dangers of drinking and driving by utilizing Fatal Vision Impairment Goggles that simulate different levels of intoxication. Participants were instructed to ride a tricycle around cones to experience the dangers of driving under the influence.
